## WOOL – WANTED!

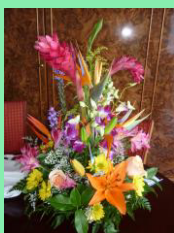

Whether you're a member of a local fuchsia society or a garden club, I would guess like me that it's been a relief that the purveyors of gloom were wrong, we haven't been locked down again, and monthly gatherings have continued, even with the snow we've had in Cornwall. Some of the challenges such as finding speakers and paying for them are still with us, so I will make no apologies for continuing to bang on about how some of us are using tech such as Zoom to alleviate these problems, how easy it is and how help is at hand if you want to give it a whirl.

My other topic with this edition is publicity and how important it is to be consistent and persistent, and that societies and clubs can't just wait for prospective members and visitors to rock up and find them. Lockdowns and restriction may be becoming a horrible memory, but I am finding with the societies and clubs, which I belong to, that memberships and attendance have not recovered back to where they were before the pandemic hit us. We can wring our hands, or we can step up and widen our efforts to publicise our various groups. Using Tech to Stay in Touch If it wasn't for that nasty little virus, we'd have never have explored the use of tech, and I do think that Facebook and Zoom has been and could be a lifeline to many of us and our enterprises in the world of fuchsias. Fuchsia Friends Gossip on Facebook Possibly the biggest success has been the Fuchsia Friends Gossip group on Facebook started just as we were being locked down (or is that locked up) in March 2020, and nearly three years on it's still going strong with a worldwide membership of 3,439 with a dozen or more posts every day. Fuchsia Friends Zoom on Fridays Later in 2020, in time for Christmas, we started the Fuchsia Friends Zoom gatherings on Friday evenings at 7 pm UK time and it's still going strong with 20 to 25 households joining in each Friday with representation from across the UK, as well as the US and Australia. Under Carol's guidance one week we'll just natter, primarily but not only about fuchsias, while the next week it'll be a talk from one of our number, with the occasional quiz thrown in to test the grey cells. If you fancy joining in just drop Carol Gubler or Ric Reilly a line and they'll let you have the Zoom joining details, and don't worry if you've not tried Zoom before as we're happy to set up a quick 1:1 introductory session to get you started.
