GROWING FUCHSIAS

- Continue feeding with a Nitrogen feed
- Water (especially during any hot spells)
- Pinch out to encourage new shoots and to develop a good shape.
- Keep turning the plants to help develop an even shape
- Check for any pests and treat
- Free cuttings – you may wish to pot up the cuttings and continue pinching out and feed regularly

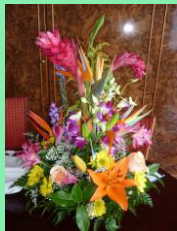
WOOL – WANTED!
