JAYNE'S JOTTINGS

Over-wintering is well and truly on the way. I have completed over-wintering my mum's fuchsias. They are all tucked away, snugly in her greenhouse and her pelargoniums and a few begonias are in her shed. I can now concentrate on mine, and I have decided against potting any up at this time of year, but have marked the ones I plan to do so by using pea sticks, so I know which ones to pot up next year.

In fact I have used the following system this year: -

Pea sticks - in pots which I intend to pot up next year

Green Plastic ties – Potential Fuchsia Bonsai candidates (I seem to have a lot of these!)

Yellow Plant labels – Fuchsias which I have regularly put on the show bench and those which I feel are possible show exhibits for next year.

I have also segregated my greenhouses with the intention of putting all show exhibits together; Standards together; Fuchsia Bonsai together, and so forth. I have tried to do this for several years now, but to no avail, so hopefully I will be more successful this year – time permitting!

However, I can't stop myself from taking extra cuttings, even though I have tried to restrict it to my favourite ones; I have taken over 120 cuttings – I just hope some survive – with not having a heated greenhouse, taking cuttings at this time is always a gamble for me! Fingers crossed.


PROJECT 2 - FUCHSIA BONSAI

As I mentioned above, I have set aside quite a few plants to work on next year, so my greenhouses at the bottom of the garden (where my rabbit hutches used to be!) is now a designated Bonsai area.

Having no heated greenhouses, I actually overwinter my bonsai the same way as I do all my other plants: -

- I give them a trim
- Defoliate
- Keep them slightly moist

In fact, I have lost more Bonsai plants through the hot summer months than over winter. I have previously located my bonsai plants in the greenhouses situated on the patio, which gets full sun and have lost them as they have frazzled in the heat. For me, they survive better over winter, even in the shallow bonsai pots.

OVERWINTERING FUCHSIAS

We must all be thinking of overwintering our fuchsias now, so here are some tips I found...

- There is no point in trying to force them to continue flowering, rather encourage them to rest (what a shame!)
- Reduce the amount of watering you give to your fuchsias which are still outside.
- Consider bringing all plants under cover.
- Make sure that your storage area is clean and free from pests.
- The plants themselves must be free from pests and diseases.
- Remove all leaves.
- Prune back some of the straggly stems.
- When all leaves and debris are removed, spray with an insecticide and fungicide.
- Don't pack the plants too tightly together.
- Provide some sort of covering, some insulating material to protect from frosts.

According to Garden Lore: -

'The weather of October is usually distinguished by its variability, heavy rains, high winds and sharp frosts...

There is generally a sharp frost about the 12th, and anything likely to be injured... Should be under shelter by the end of the first week.'

<u>Duties of the Honorary Treasurer, Nottingham and Notts Fuchsia</u> <u>Society</u>

To maintain the bank accounts of the Society (held at NatWest, Long Eaton & NS&I investment)

To maintain an annual account to support the income & expenditure account. (currently an excel double entry workbook & supporting documents)

To prepare an annual statement of account for the AGM in November *. (The financial year for the Society is November 1st to October 31st.)

* Ensure accounts are audited by the competent person approved at the previous AGM prior to presentation at the AGM.
